Add a bit of funk to your bedroom with this charger and sound system for iPod Nanos (first and second generation). GrooveToons will wake you up with your favourite songs/playlists, and while you sleep it can be charging your Nano. It comes in five colours and has a clock, alarm and snooze setting. For portable users, you can power it with six AA batteries. It's \$199.

### Getting into the blues

Turning the air blue are three cool products to help Bluetooth gadgets communicate. The Sudio Linc is a tiny stick you plug it into a computer's USB port and it will simultaneously connect up to seven different Bluetooth gadgets (including a keyboard or mouse). It claims a fast data transfer rate of up to 3Mbps. It's \$49. The Sudio Alto is a compact Bluetooth stereo headset, pictured far left, which costs \$99.95. It's just 28g, has an in-built microphone and 10 hours of music or talk time. Then there's the Sudio Brio, a Bluetooth speakerphone, pictured left, that, wait for it, has caller ID. At last a way to screen your boss's calls while on the road! It has up to six hours talk time, voice dialling, conference calling and supports phone book synchronising. It pairs with up to eight different devices at a time – great if one unit is swapped around a team. It's \$149 from most phone stores.
