One of Force's latest releases is the Sudio Vogue, which is a zero install, visor mounted hands-free unit. Just as basic a black variant doesn't cut it in the handset space any more, Sudio's Vogue range comes in four different colours - metallic blue, pink, white and black. Something for everyone, from conserve black to more flamboyant pink or metallic blue.

Size wise, the Sudio Vogue has to be one of the smallest visor mounted hands-free units, about the width of a standard candy bar handset, but slightly longer.

Even though a micro hands-free unit, up to 10 hours talk and 480 hours stand-by time is available.

It's really easy to use, with streamlined pairing and only three buttons to operate. Being cute, affordable and simple might help to prompt

new, first time users of Bluetooth hands-free. After all, most phones include Bluetooth as standard these days.

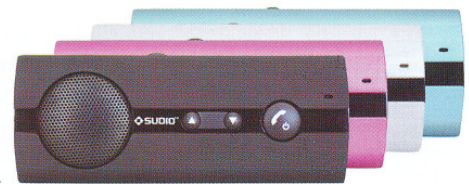
Features include one touch answer, call waiting, last re-dial, mute and call reject.
